

On Thursday we had a Celebration of Culture organised by the Staff Arts Council.



In the Chapel we focused on Lourdes, a place of pilgrimage in France, where people of different nations gatherer from all over the world and celebrate Mass in their own native languages and in their own styles of music. The sick are the most important people in Lourdes and are given seats of honour at the front.

There may be an African Mass, followed by a French Mass, an Indian Mass, Italian, English etc. There is also an International Mass where all nations gather together a basilica.







At night they have a Torch-light Procession with candles as everyone gathers together to pray the Holy rosary in different languages.



A number of our Year 8 Students represented this in our Chapel dressed in their different cultural costumes and they prayed the rosary prayers in different languages: Lithuanian, Shona (Zimbabwe, German, Italian, Swahili (Kenya), Greek, Haitian Creole, Dhaka (Bangladesh), Yoruba (Nigeria), Telugu (India), Romanian and Japanese.





Amazing talent came to light as we discovered that Amara in Year 8 who is half Nigerian and half Jamaican can also speak Spanish, French, Chinese, Japanese and Turkish. She chose to represent Japan for us on this occasion and was fluent in Japanese.



Year 7's Pilgrimage to Aylesford Priory



This week Year 7's went on pilgrimage to Aylesford Priory, where a group of Carmelite Friars from the Holy Land (Mount Carmel) set up a monastery in 1242. Mary the Mother of God appeared to one of the Friars Saint Simon Stock who was the Prior at the time, and promised protection for the Community and all who wore the brown scapular in a time of persecution. The Carmelite order survived and flourished to this day. Aylesford is a holy place

because it has been soaked in the prayers of pilgrims for many centuries. There is a wonderful sense of peace and calm in the many Chapels and beautiful grounds.





Saint Joseph is the

protector of the Holy Family and so we prayed that by God's grace he will protect our families too, through his powerful intercession.

We prayed for our families and for our School family, for the sick, the house-bound and those in care homes. Also for a new-born baby who is in need or our prayers.

We are very grateful to Fr Stephen and Deacon Matus who came to celebrate Mass for us in the beautiful St. Joseph's Chapel. Fr Stephen explained the Old and New Testament Bible stories that are depicted around the Chapel and the importance of art and images in conveying

the Good News, especially to those who could not read or write. We may take our free education for granted today, but it past times only the rich could afford to be educated, to own books and learn to read and write. Arts and images are important visual teaching aids. Fr Stephen explained the story of Elijah and the golden thread of justice that runs through the Old Testament which shows that God blesses those who listen, obey and do his will, rather than doing things our way.

Fr Stephen taught the girls a very joyful 'Alleluia' and had fun with them standing up and sitting down. Our Year 7's sang their best accompanied by Mr White at the Keyboard. They read beautifully and did a sketch to illustrate Jesus instructions to his disciples to wait and pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit; and how they gathered in prayer with Mary the Mother of God and the Holy Spirit came upon them all on the day of Pentecost. In the same way, we are called to wait and pray to be empowered by the Holy Spirit, before we commence the work God has called each one of us to do.

We prayed particularly for our Grandparents in Saint Anne's Chapel



Saint Anne was the mother of Mary and maternal Grandmother of Jesus. One of the girls who knew so many different types of trees and plants said she learnt it all from her grandmother.

The girls enjoyed the beautiful grounds, including the Rosary Garden and Peace Garden, where the word Peace is written in all different

languages of the world. They were very courteous and well-behaved and were a credit to our school and their families. We are very grateful to all the group leaders for

- Tap the settings icon
- Tap block and follow the steps in the app

Users can also **bulk report**, delete or block up to 100 comments or accounts at once by long-pressing on a comment or tapping the pencil icon in the upper-left corner to open a window of further options.



Control your comment section

You have the power to decide whether you want to allow comments on videos from everyone, followers only, or restrict them altogether. Using profile settings, you can filter all comments to prevent certain keywords, or pre-approve any comment that appears on your video.
