Feast of the Epiphany

This feast is traditionally celebrated on 6th January, but this year the Holy Day of Obligation is transferred to Sunday 7th January 2024.

Miss Collis gave a lovely assembly about the Epiphany relating it to our understanding of diversity. The Epiphany is the day when the wise men (the kings) who had been seeking the new born King whose reign will be without end, came to worship Jesus. The wise men came from different parts of the world, from different countries and cultures: they represent all of us, the gentiles (non-Jews) and Jesus welcomes everyone. Epiphany means showing and it is the day that Jesus was revealed to the whole world.

On the Continent, the Feast of the Epiphany is called Little Christmas and it is the day they give their Christmas presents because the kings gave Jesus gifts of gold for a king, frankincense because he is God, and myrrh for buriel, because he is the sacrifice, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world and rises again, bringing eternal life to us all. Jesus is the Light of the World, bringing light and hope in our darkness, for he has overcome the world. Our future is secure in Him.

In our Form prayers we have also been thinking about the Epiphany, and reflecting on Emmanuel, God with us and the many ways he reveals himself to us in our daily lives.

Tomorrow is the Feast of the Epiphany, the Showing of Christ to the World



700yrs before the birth of Jesus, the Prophet Isaiah (60:3,6) foretold: "Nations will be drawn to your light and kings to the dawning of your new day... They will come from Sheba, bringing gold and incense."

Psalm 72: "The kings of Spain, Arabia and Ethiopia will bring him offerings.

All kings will bow down before him."
When the Wise men saw the child with Mary his mother, they knelt down and worshipped him.
Then opening their treasures, they presented him gifts of gold, frankincense

(Gold for a king, frankincense for God and myrrh for his burial.)

and myrrh. Matt. 2:11



The Epiphany is known as Little Christmas! 'Our Christmas', because the wise men were from different countries and represent all the nations of the world. Jesus welcomes everyone and invites us all to come close to him as brothers and sisters in the one family of God. The wise men persevered in their long journey searching for Jesus until they found and worshipped him.

Reflection: Jesus, Emmanuel, God is with us always.

He is not hiding from us. He uses all our faculties - intelligence, senses, imagination etc.to communicate with each one of us in our own personal way. We encounter his presence in: those in need, in children, through the kindness of others, through dreams, through the beauty of nature, through art, music, dance, sport, through the wisdom of our elders, those who God provides to care for us, through his holy Word in the Bible and especially in receiving Him in Holy Communion at Mass. Wherever there is loving kindness, God is there. Our personal epiphany is when we suddenly recognise and understand his presence with us.

Where have you seen Jesus during the Christmas holiday?

The wise men offered precious gifts. What gift will you offer to Jesus? (One of our most precious gifts is time.)

The wise men knelt down and worshipped him. Do you spend time with God in loving worship? True worship is to do God's will and obey him.

To be a Christian means to be a follower of Christ - to be like Christ, everywhere, at all times. How can we be more Christ –like (gentle, loving, kind, fair, honest, compassionate) this year?


